Kate Williams

"After completing my nursing degree and working at the Prince of Wales Hospital, I decided to return to university to study midwifery - which has evolved into a very exciting and challenging role as a midwife with the RHW 'Malabar Midwifery Community Link Service'.



After undertaking my midwifery studies at UTS, I completed a one year rotation placement with the Royal. In November 2006 I commenced my role with the 'Malabar Midwives'.

The Community Link Service is a very different environment compared with that of the hospital environment, and changing to a 'case load' based practice has offered me autonomy and flexibility.

I find the relationship with the women we see offers a close connection, developing a high level of honesty and trust. This enables a continuity of care, and is beneficial in assisting a woman keeping to her birth plan.

A primary focus of the Malabar Midwifery Community Link Service is the Aboriginal community, of which 30% of our case load comprises. The Service is also available to women based in the Maroubra/Malabar area. I work alongside a team of six midwives at the clinic, and we are divided into two teams of three".

In May of this year, Kate's talent and dedication was rewarded with a nomination for the NSW Midwives Associates 'Midwife of the Year Award'. Kate was a finalist, and attended a presentation function to receive her award.

Amongst the highlights in her role as a midwife, Kate lists the challenging and rewarding nature of her work, with a strong focus on social services. "Also being Aboriginal, and working directly with the La Perouse and Malabar community is fulfilling" said Kate.

Kate, along with fellow midwives of the Link Service, prides herself on keeping women informed and educated; and providing very tailored and personalised midwifery care throughout their journey of pregnancy, labour, birth and parenting.
